## Brenda Hopkins Miranda Biography

Brenda Hopkins Miranda was born and raised in San Juan, Puerto Rico. Her father Harold Hopkins grew up in a farm in Stanwood, Michigan. He left his farm life to join the Peace Corps and traveled to Puerto Rico where he met Brenda's mother Margarita Miranda, who grew up in a mountain town called Corozal.

Brenda's childhood was filled with sounds from all over the world. From an early age her profound sensibilities led her to intuitively reject stylistic boundaries. Having grown up with the magical blend of rhythms and melodies, which encompasses Puerto Rican music, she expanded her sound include Soul, Blues, R&B, Funk, Jazz, Bluegrass, Rock and all sorts of multicultural fusions.

Brenda began her musical path at the age of five, when she started taking piano, ballet and painting lessons at Bonneville School. Because of her remarkable talent she was admitted to the Conservatorio de Música de Puerto Rico to begin undergraduate studies in Classical Piano at 16 years of age while still attending high school.

She holds a Bachelors Magna cum Laude degree in Classical Piano from the Conservatorio, was awarded a Berklee School of Music scholarship, has a Masters degree with honors in Contemporary Improvisation from New England Conservatory, completed and Doctoral Studies in Musicology at the Universidad de Granada in Spain.

As a bandleader Hopkins Miranda has released six recordings: "Boricua on Board" (1998), "Bohemia" (1999), "Recuerdos de Granada" (2009), "Simple" (2012), "Aeropiano" (2014) and "Puentes" (2017).
